QUARTERLY MEMBERSHIP MEETING THURSDAY, MAY 2, 2013, 5:30 P.M. MORROW BOARD ROOM, INDIANA LANDMARKS

President Marjorie Kienle called the meeting to order at 5:34 p.m. She deferred the regular business of the meeting to later on the agenda, to allow the guest speaker to be first. She introduced Ehren Bingaman, Executive Director of the Central Indiana Regional Transportation Authority (CIRTA), an organization created by the state and made up of 11 counties, as well as several municipalities in the area. Ehren made some introductory remarks, showed a video made by INDY CONNECT, which is an initiative made up of CIRTA, IndyGo Transit System, and Metropolitan Planning Organization. Ehren then took questions and comments from the meeting attendees.

Following Ehren's presentation, Marjorie explained that most HUNI members represent specific neighborhoods, but that the HUNI's bylaws do allow for individual members who do not represent any particular neighborhood. There are currently a few individual members, including HUNI past president, Lorraine Vavul. Although she's stepped down from her previous role, Lorraine has taken on the responsibility of chairing the editorial board, which will work to improve the HUNI website.

Marjorie touched on details surrounding the National Trust for Historic Preservation's 2013 National Preservation Conference, which will be from October 29 to November 2. Gary Chilluffo, Hospitality Chair, added that about 800 volunteers will be needed. He encouraged people to volunteer by contacting Rebecca Smith at rsmith@indianalandmarks.org. Both shorter shifts like greeters and longer shifts like docents are needed.

Chad Lethig announced that the Indiana Moderne Tour will be in Bloomington this year.

HUNI members reported on projects and/or upcoming events in their respective neighborhoods.

There will be a dedication and tour of the Cultural Trail on May 11, with a variety of associated events. Many new restaurants have opened recently.

Old Northside

A \$10,000,000 Lilly Endowment grant was awarded to work on the O'Bannon Old Northside Soccer Park.

The New Tinker Street Committee continues its efforts to improve the appearance of E. 16th Street (originally called Tinker Street) which runs through both the Old Northside and Herron-Morton Place. The New Tinker Street Committee now has a Facebook page.
