- -Federal budget passed investments in neighborhoods, youth services, crime prevention, public transit, housing, infrastructure
- -Annual job fair at Ivy Tech Culinary Center
- -Youth phone app competition

State Senator Andrea Hunley

- -Focused on protecting funding for low barrier shelter shifts in the economic enhancement district
- -Moving into more supportive housing programming
- -Professional Sports Development Area council on May 13th
- -Lead water line replacements put more funding behind it

IHPC Emergency Designation for Holy Cross: Calvin Nguyen

- -In March the neighborhood found out the church was going to be demolished
- -Indiana Landmarks requested the emergency designation through IHPC church, school, and gym
- -Approved by both the Indianapolis Historic Preservation Commission & Metropolitan Development Commission
- -Next step: reaching out to archdiocese to talk about the future of the site
- -After the emergency designation, the archdiocese pulled the St. Rita (nomination in process) and Sacred Heart (in discussion) National Register nominations

Rethink 65/70: Charlie Richardson

- -Federal planning grant on the southeast gateway community engagement underway
- -ProPEL mid-May the consultants will file we will have 45 days to respond with comments mark your calendar for the end of June for a public hearing
- -ProPEL committee meetings June 3rd
- -I-65 SAFE public hearing this summer check in with Bruce Colville and Storrow Kinsella
- -I-65 SAFE Rethink Coalition worked with 9 neighborhoods on a quality of life report
- -Neighborhoods need to speak about impacts/quality of life issues

- -Meeting with Council for ordinance language edits
- -Edits included things like impacts on authenticity and stability of neighborhoods; impact/welfare on economy; changes to parking because of permeable surfaces; zoning changes-added ADUs, mixed use buildings, etc
- -State law is so restrictive in terms of what we can do
- -Short term rental has a strong lobbying arm
- -Council and mayoral policymakers have been receptive

-Billboard relocation variance request outside of I-465, in the Greater Allisonville Community Council area - working with Marion County Association of Neighborhood Associations

- -75ft billboard proposed the ordinance is for 40ft but the billboard company said they would decrease to 65ft moved further back from 465
- -BZA Meeting moved to 5/21 at 1pm special exception to locate a new billboard on Chief Lane inside of I-465 (not allowed by ordinance)
